

Dr. Robyn R. Mace, CPP, is a Specialist in the School of Criminal Justice at Michigan State University where she conducts research on supply chain protection and defense, organizational strategy, emerging crimes (including computer crime and counterfeiting), and teaches *Issues in Terrorism* in the Homeland Security Certificate program.

While earning her doctorate, Dr. Mace was Principal Planner/Program Development Specialist at the Jersey City Police Department in Jersey City, NJ. In that capacity, she analyzed operational and strategic problems, developed and evaluated innovative and current programs, assisted in building the Department's crime analysis capacity, and implemented grant-related and multi-agency cooperative public safety and information sharing programs (gangs and delinquency, curfew and truancy, domestic violence, and crime analysis).
